

How to Measure Your Ring Size

When shopping for someone else, the best way to find their ring size is to ask them. But if you're planning a surprise, it's best to ask your friends and family to ask that person discreetly.

The average women's ring size ranges from size 3 to 9. The most purchased women's rings range from size 5 to 7. Size 6 is the most common one. The average men's ring size ranges from size 6 to 13. The most purchased men's rings range from size 8 to 10-½. Size 9 is the most common one. These standard ring sizes can help you know which way to go. Printable Ring Sizing Chart

Our printable ring sizer is the ideal tool for you when you want to measure your ring size. Just print this guide and place a ring you already own over the circles, matching the inside of the ring to the circle closest in size. If the ring is between two circle sizes, the larger one is the best choice. Our online ring sizer is the easiest and fastest way to find the correct ring size.

Measure Your Ring Size With String, Paper & Ruler

- Wrap the base of your finger using string or paper.
- Mark the point where the ends meet with a pen.
- Measure the string or paper with a ruler (mm) and divide by 3.14 (or Pi) to get the ring diameter.
- Choose the closest measurement on the ring sizing chart to find your size.

More Ring Sizing Tips:

- The ring should fit comfortably on your finger: It should feel snug enough that it won't fall off but loose enough to slip over the knuckle.
- If the knuckle is larger than the finger's base, measure both areas and choose a size in between.
- Measure your ring size at night when your fingers are warm. Finger size changes depending on the time of day and the weather; fingers are smaller in the morning and when it is cold. Also, remember that the fingers of your dominant hand are usually larger.
- Measure 3 or 4 times to ensure accuracy.

What Happens if I Need to Resize My Ring?

The ring resizing process requires adding or removing small amounts of metal according to the difference between the purchased size and the new size requested. After resizing, your ring may be slightly thicker or thinner. These small changes are usually imperceptible to the eye and will ensure the best fit.

After resizing the band, each ring is cleaned and polished before it is returned to you. Our expert jewelers follow strict quality standards to make your resized ring sparkle and fit perfectly.
